Forklift License Markham - Within North America, obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators may get a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks that come with a variety of alternatives, like stand-up and sit-down. There are different types and sizes of forklift suitable for different industrial applications. Operator training programs are normally individualized in order to deal with the certain uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift within a warehouse surroundings will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to focus on detailed program requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to acquire their forklift certification or license. This method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery within the workplace. Employers could choose to train workers on each and every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation methods, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company rules. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like dangerous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate each and every type of lift truck on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process would usually consist of an on-site component with hands-on practice.

Usually, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the current employer to the next employer. Receiving a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety will always be an important aspect of the lift truck license training, even if the particulars of the safety training will be dependent upon the machines being used. Some safety issues will differ for each employer and industry. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore operations.
